#### Minutes of Meeting No. 2 /29/2019-20

Meeting of Governing Body of State Health Society (Delhi) was held on 02.01.2020 at 11AM in the Conference Hall-3 of Delhi Secretariat under the Chairmanship of Chairman, State Health Society (Delhi).

List of participants is as per Annexure –I.

**Agenda No. 1:** Minutes of the meeting of Governing Body of State Health Society (Delhi) held on 19/11/2019 were circulated to all its members.

Representation as received from State Program Officer (RCH) and SPO (PNDT) to modify the minutes for agenda point no.10 which were earlier recorded in the minutes of meeting held on 19.11.2019 as under:

10 Provision for keeping Rs. 50,000/- in cash for Informer reward scheme from funds approved under ROP 2019-20

State Health Society) (Delhi) approved the proposal of maintaining cash of Rs. 50,000-/ in the RCH Accounts Section for the activity. It has also been directed that Accounts Section may book the amount as expenditure if money is lost, However, in case currency notes (evidence money) become property of court, they may be booked as advance and should be adjusted when received back after court orders.

SPO RCH has requested for action to be recorded as "The money if lost may be treated as loss to exchequer and proceedings for writing off of the amount be initiated and approval from the competent authority may be taken for writing off the amount."

Further, SPO PNDT has informed that usually, it takes some time to plan the decoy operation after information is received. So, rather than maintaining cash, prior information (upto 3 working days before the raid) may be given to Finance Section of DSHM to arrange cash for the operation.

With reference to observation of SPO (RCH), it was directed that since this scheme is already in place in Haryana & Rajasthan and also similar decoy operations are being conducted by other departments of Delhi Government, the practice followed by these organizations may be explored and decision taken accordingly by Dy Director (Finance). However, approval for maintaining the cash as per decision taken in meeting of Governing Body of SHS (D) held on 19.11.2019 was upheld.

## Agenda-4:- Rationalization of monthly remuneration of staff under NIDDCP at par with other staff under DSHM

With the launch of National Health Mission in 2005, all vertical programs including NIDDCP were re-positioned under NRHM by GoI. Delhi State Health Mission was launched in 2006 and all the National Health Programs were implemented by State Health Society.

It was informed that the service conditions of contractual engagements under NIDDCP were different from that of contractual engagements under DSHM, so while the integration of the program under the umbrella of DSHM, Mission Direction, DSHM had proposed to have a structural integration with DSHM which was approved by Pr. Secretary (Health and Family Welfare), GNCTD and Hon'ble Minister of Health and Family Welfare, GNCTD.

The following was proposed:

- Lab Technician and Lab Assistant working under NIDDCP may be paid remuneration at par with the contractual engagements under DSHM.
- Annual enhancement may be done as per approval of State Health Society (Delhi)
  which is in line with the approval received from MoHFW, GoI.
- Leave rules as per DSHM guidelines may be applied.
- Any deviation from the existing norms of Delhi State Health Mission will need approval from the competent authority.

SHS (D) directed that possibility to float a fresh advertisement for recruitment of staff approved under NIDDCP may be explored and the matter may be put up to executive Committee in its next meeting.

#### Agenda-5:- Proposal for financial support to contractual engagements in case of death

SHS (D) was informed there are a few contractual engagements in the Mission who expired while on duty, like an ANM in IDHS North died due to fall from roof while on Polio Duty and an RNTCP Employee died while he was on field. Rs 5 Lakh was paid as an ex-gratia amount from CM relief fund to the family of RNTCP employee.

Also, contractual engagements may contract serious communicable diseases like Tuberculosis while on duty.

The Governing Body of SHS (D) directed that a committee may be constituted to study the models in other States and make recommendations for consideration.

#### Agenda-6:- Proposal for medical insurance for contractual engagements under DSHM

SHS (D) was informed that repeated requests are being received from contractual engagements under DSHM for extending medical benefits for self and family. Also, proposal for providing DGEHS card to contractual engagements under DSHM was submitted twice to DGHS which was denied.



It was also informed that funds for medical insurance have been approved for Rajasthan in ROP 2018-19.

It was proposed that a committee may constituted for deciding the modality, amount of sum insured per person and inclusions in medical insurance and a proposal may be submitted to GoI for extending funds for medical insurance to contractual engagements under DSHM.

The Governing Body of SHS (D) directed that a committee may be constituted to study the models in other States and make recommendations for consideration.

Agenda Point No. 7:- To adopt the financial guidelines issued by MoHFW under Operational guidelines for Financial Management under NHM.

#### Agenda Point No. 12:- Reduction in number of functional CATS ambulances

Governing Body of SHS (D) was informed that Delhi State Health Mission provides financial support for operationalization to CATS for 120 Patient Transport ambulances and 100 Basic Life Support (BLS) ambulances. However, it has been informed that number of functional ambulances has reduced to 80 Patient Transport ambulances and 88 Basic Life Support (BLS) ambulances.

It was proposed that funds for operationalization of CATS may be provided on pro -rata basis as per functional ambulances available.

Governing Body of SHS (D) approved provision of funds to CATS on pro-rata basis as per functional ambulances available.

Governing Body of SHS (D) was informed that a proposal was received from Chest Clinic R.K.Mission for the functioning of this Clinic as a model DTC cum DRTB Centre with its own recruits to ensure continued innovation and greater accountability while delivering services in a cost effective manner. The Central TB Division, Govt. of India had endorsed such innovation as per the minutes of the meeting held on 17-10-2018. This proposal of Rs. 93.32 lacs was proposed in the PIP 2019-20 and amount of Rs. 69.28 lacs has been approved in ROP 2019-20.

Governing Body of SHS (D) directed to submit the proposal on file for examination.

a) Ongoing Activities- All ongoing activities are being proposed.

All ongoing activities have been approved to be proposed by SHS (D).

#### b) Human Resource-

All existing Human Resource is being proposed with 5% enhancement in monthly remuneration. 5% enhancement has been proposed on the monthly remuneration for 2019 including loyalty bonus assuming loyalty bonus shall be approved as per proposal in Supplementary PIP 2019-20 which Is under submission.

CDEO- It is submitted that as per administrative approval of State PIP, lumpsum amount is received for outsourcing of CDEOs. The existing CDEOs need to be paid from the lump sum funds approved. A corresponding enhancement in the Lumpsum amount may be proposed.

SHS (D) approved the proposal of Human Resource with enhancement of 5% for all eligible categories.

- c) North DMC- The following proposals have been received:
  - Trainings of Medical Officers and para medical staff with fund requirement of Rs. 1,83,027/-
  - IEC activities- For Material and Communication (Handbills, posters, Flex Boards and LCD) with a budget estimate of Rs. 10 Lakh has been proposed.
  - Drugs @ Rs.12 Cr have been proposed, approval of Rs.9.54 Cr proposed in Supp. PIIP 2019-20 is awaited.
  - Manpower-3 Lab Technicians, 6 Lab Assistants, 8 Dental Hygienist and 5 Public Health Nurse are being proposed for existing vacant posts with budget of Rs. 1,43,03,352/-
    - SHS (D) was informed that as per the existing provisions, support under NHM is intended to support and supplement and not to substitute the State Expenditure. NHM aims to strengthen health system, hence should not be used to substitute regular HR. Support of HR will be to the extent of positions engaged over and above the regular positions.
  - Contingency-Rs 5000/- per centre for 8 Centres with total fund requirement of Rs.
     4.8 Lakh has been proposed.
    - SHS (D) was informed that as per existing provisions under DSHM, an amount of Rs 24000 is being approved (@ Rs.2000/- per month) as contingency for facilities.

SHS (D) approved the proposal of North MCD for trainings with financial implication of Rs. 1,83,027/-, IEC activities with a budget estimate of Rs. 10 Lakh and Contingency @ Rs.2000/- per month per facility with financial implication of Rs. 1.92 lakh for 8 Centres.



d) <u>South DMC:</u> The proposal submitted by SDMC is generic in nature without any justification without any customized requirement. South Corporation has been requested to inform the requirement as per proposal finalized by their engineering wing. HR has been proposed for existing vacant posts, which is not as per prevailing policies under DSHM.

The proposal received for procurement of various items approved in 2017-18, couldn't be approved because of the variation in quantity and amount of total approved budget. Various equipments requested for procurement are not as per existing guidelines for Primary healthcare facility, For eg. Ultrasound, X-Ray Machine, Defibrillator etc. SDMC has been requested to revise the proposal as per existing provisions.

SHS (D) directed the proposal may be resubmitted for consideration.

#### e) Monitoring & Evaluation:

- Budget of Rs. 279.34 lakh has been proposed in PIP 2020-21 under M&E for ongoing activities
- Re-validation of the already approved Rs.144 lakh for 800 tablets @ Rs.18000/- per tablet shall be sought for use in 2020-21.

SHS (D) approved the proposal of Monitoring & Evaluation.

#### n ASHA Scheme-

- All ongoing activities are being proposed.
- One new activity in form of a proposal to conduct a study on assessment of home-based newborn care (HBNC) for competency and operational ease in the setting of Delhi by Department of Community Medicine, MAMC is being projected under budget head: Total financial implication (U.10.2.1.): Rs. 16,41,000/-

SHS (D) approved the proposal to conduct a study on assessment for HBNC with financial implication of Rs.16.41 Lakh.

## g) Setting up / sustaining Mahila Arogya Samitis:

i.. 100 MAS were formed through the existing ARC structure by the district ASHA Coordinators in their districts. The activity for setting up / sustaining 110 MAS , has been proposed in PIP 2020-21 with financial implications of 3.95 lacs and 5.5 lac as untied funds for these MAS. (Rs. 9.45 Lacs) . Budget head U.3.2.1.2.

ii. In the year 2019-20 , 75 lacs were approved for the activity of formation of 2500 MAS spread over 2 to 3 identified districts using an NGO Model. Further , 125 lacs was approved for the untied fund for these 2500 MAS . Work was done in this regard and an appropriate RFP was framed by the designated committee and go ahead received from the competent authority. Decision may be taken on revalidation of this fund (200 lacs) by GOI. (Budget head U.3.2.1.2).

SHS (D) approved that funds for setting up/sustaining Mahila Arogya Samitis may be sought for revalidation.



- h) Maternal Health: The following new activities are being proposed:
  - Surakshit Matritva Aashwasan (SUMAN) is an initiative that focuses on assured, dignified and respectful delivery of quality healthcare services at no cost and zero tolerance for denial of services to any woman and newborn visiting a public health facility in order to end all preventable maternal and newborn deaths and morbidities and provide a positive birthing experience. Most of the components grouped under SUMAN are being implemented in the State with the exception of following interventions:
    - Time bound redressal of grievances through a responsive call center/helpline
    - Choice for delayed cord clamping beyond 5 minutes/upto delivery of placenta
    - Assured referral services with scope of reaching health facility within 1 hour of any critical case emergency
    - Birth registration certificates from healthcare facilities

Financial proposal for introduction of these initiatives have been incorporated in the State PIP 2020-21 as per following details:

Rs. 1000/- as an incentive for reporting maternal death @ Rs. 1000/- for 100 for maternal deaths.

 Janani Shishu Suraksha Karyakram (JSSK)- Till date funds were only being sought under the maternal component. In the current F.Y, funds have been utilized for JSSK initiatives in neonates and infants. Accordingly, funds are being proposed for free drugs and consumables for Child health and free diagnosis for sick infants under JSSK.

SHS (D) approved the proposal for SUMAN and JSSK in -principle. SHS (D) has directed to deal the technical aspects of SUMAN on file.

- i) <u>Child Health-</u> The following new activities are being proposed:
  - Strengthening of Reporting from Nurseries in Delhi Govt. Hospitals- Funds to
    the tune of Rs. 5.5 Lakhs per Nursery for 14 Nurseries (Rs. 1 Lakh for Computer
    & Accessories, Rs. 0.50 Lakhs for Internet & Broadband, Rs. 1 Lakhs for Printing
    & Rs. 3 Lakhs for outsourcing the CDEO @ Rs. 25000 for 12 months)
  - Roll out Of Social Awareness and Actions to Neutralize Pneumonia Successfully (SAANS) in State of Delhi - Total financial implication to rollout SAANS initiative is Rs. 332.95 Lakhs.

SHS (D) approved the proposal for roll out of SAANS and Strengthening of Reporting from Nurseries in Delhi Govt. Hospitals with financial implication of Rs. 332.95 Lakh and 5.5 Lakh respectively.



j) Routine Immunization - The following new activities is being proposed:

Strengthening of Monitoring supervision of immunization activities and cased based VPD surveillance in the State.

Funds to the tune of Rs. 231.00 lakhs (7 IMF per district for 11 districts at the rate of Rs. 25000/- for 12 months) may be proposed in PIP 2020-21.

- k) Family Planning: The following new activities are being proposed:
  - State Survey on Family Planning Indicators with funds of Rs.27.0 lakh.
  - Transportation of Family Planning commodities with fund requirement of Rs.1,40,800/- For 11 districts for Transportation of Family Planning commodities from state to Districts @ 3200 per trip x 4 such trips.
  - Laparoscope Camera & Video Laparoscope with fund requirement of Rs.30.0 lakh for 10 hospitals for cameras and Rs. 60.0 lakh for video laparoscopes.

Agenda Point No. 16:- To adopt the Pattern of Assistance governing GIA to DSHM for expenditure pertaining to Aam Aadmi Mohalla Clinics.

As per the Pattern of Assistance governing Grant In Aid to DSHM dated 09-10-2018 issued by Jt. Secretary, Deptt. of Health and Family Welfare, GNCTD, few conditions pertaining to fund management for Aam Aadmi Mohalla Clinics are reproduced as here under:

As per clause 4(vii) regarding Grant for recurring expenditure, DSHM will open a separate account for running and management of Aam Aadmi Mohalla Clinic. DGHS will be responsible for proper maintenance of account and expenditure under Capital & Revenue. DGHS will submit utilization certificate through DSHM for further release of fund.

As per clause 4(vii), the fund for management and running of AAMC will be released directly to a dedicated account opened for the purpose.

As per clause 5 regarding grant for Non recurring expenditure, Non recurring expenditure will be incurred on following items for managing and running state specified specific scheme by GNCTD.

- a) Purchase of equipments and stores, computers, telephone etc.
- b) Modernizing existing facilities
- c) Manpower development etc.

Proposal for expenditure for items to be procured under this head shall be with the approval of Director General Health Services as per the provision under GFR and in accordance with rules of Delhi Govt. The Director General Health Services will submit Utilization Certificate on Form-19A of GFR in respect of Non-recurring grant released during the previous financial year.

The administrative in-charges will be responsible for strict observance of all the codal formalities, General Financial Rule, the terms and conditions of the grant and the



directions/advice of Delhi Government/GoI in case of CSS while utilizing the grant. The grant will be utilized only for the specified approved purpose.

As per clause 13(iii) regarding Re-appropriation of Funds, For GIA under State Scheme: Release of grant by itself does not become a license to spend the money. Any expenditure out of this grant would be subject to prior expenditure sanction by the competent authority, observance of provision of GFRs and instructions/guidelines issued by FD to grantee institutions from time-to-time and also economy instructions of the Government of NCT of Delhi.

As per clause 14(f), General conditions, any decision for creation of major financial liability on account of recurring/non-recurring expenses directly or indirectly, should be subject to prior approval of Govt. of NCT of Delhi.

Other conditions as per pattern of assistance as follows:

Clause 15(ii), While utilizing the grant, Director General Health Services will be responsible for observance of all the codal formalities, General Financial Rules, the terms and conditions of the grant and the directions/advice issued by Govt. of NCT of Delhi time-to-time.

Clause 15(vi), The Society shall observe all the instructions issued by the Finance Department GNCTD from time-to-time

Clause 15(vii), Assets acquired/created wholly or substantially out of the grant given by the Govt. of NCT of Delhi shall not be disposed of without obtaining the prior approval of the authority which sanctioned the grants.

Clause 15(viii), The provisions of budget for grant needs to be made on net deficit basis (i.e. total revenue from all source-total expenses) for State Specified funded by GNCTD.

In-principle approval to the provision of pattern of Assistance was accorded by the Governing Body of State Health Society (Delhi). SHS (D) directed that the decision for Governing Principles of Financial Management of AAMC Project may be taken by Mission Director after discussion with Director General of Health Services, Dy. Director (Finance) and State Nodal Officer (AAMC Control Cell).
