# Minutes of the State Health Society Meeting (No. 4/17/2013-14) held on 15/01/2014

Meeting of the State Health Society (Delhi) was held on 15/01/2014 at 11 A.M. in Conference Hall, SPMU, DSHM, Vikas Bhawan-II.

List of participants is at Annexure-I.

The proceedings and decisions are as follows:

Agenda No.1- The minutes of the SHS (D) meeting held on 25-09-2013 were confirmed.

Agenda No.2- Action taken report on the minutes of the State Health Society meeting held on 25/09/2013 was shared.

- (i) SHS (D) was informed about the proposal sent by DSHM to allow the amount approved for EPF to the contractual engagements by GoI, in their remuneration as EPF is not allowed as per rules. SHS approved to allow the amount approved for EPF to be included in the contractual remuneration being paid to the employees, only if the approvals are received from GoI.
- (ii) SHS (D) approved the districtwise allocation as per Annexure-IL.
- (iii) State Immunization Officer informed that a decision regarding AMC will be taken and in case mechanics are required, the provision for Annual Maintenance Contract and/or mechanics will be included in PIP 2014-15.
- (iv) SHS (D) approved the renewal of contracts of the existing contractual engagements under DSHM w.e.f. 01.01.14 or date of actual joining upto 31.12.14 or upto the age of 65 whichever is earlier as per list of employees is placed at Annexure-III.
- (v) SHS (D) approved the constitution of Grievance Redressal Committee. However, it was directed that besides the existing members as per following details. It should also have a representative from Director, Health Services.
  - a. Dr. Bimlesh Yadav, SPO (DFW)
  - b. Mr. Hardev Singh Chauhan, SPM
  - c. Ms. ASHA Bentur, HRD Consultant

SHS (D) approved Dr. G.C. Malik, CDMO, South District to be DHS, Representatives.

Also the committee shall meet once a month compulsorily after getting the issues by mail.

(vi) SHS (D) was informed that as per information compiled by SPMU 11 transfers on mutual basis have been done by the districts. It was approved that the process may be repeated annually.



- (vii) Enhancement of Monthly Remuneration: SHS was informed that as per information from Mission Director, State will be allowed an increase of 15% in the NHM budget. Hence, 15% enhancement in contractual remuneration is being proposed in the State PIP 2014-15. State Health Society (D) desired that a committee may be constituted to assess the admissible enhancement for various categories with Representative from DHS, RNTCP & DFW. SPO (DSHM) to coordinate.
  - (viii) The SHS (D) was informed that entire amount has been transferred from ICICI Bank to Bank of India. The account is to be closed by ICICI Bank shortly.
  - (ix) A communication has been sent to Income Tax Commissioner for direction regarding Income Tax Calculation for the contractual employees under DSHM.
  - (X) SHS (D) directed that a Cabinet Note to be put up by SPO RNTCP requesting state funds for parity with DSHM contractual engagements for similarly placed staffs. The SHS also deliberated the possibility of requesting Cabinet for authorizing Hon'ble Health Minister to take decision on the issue of parity within the different verticals which may arise in future from the state funds.

SHS (D) was informed that the as per approval by SHS (D) Statutory Audit for the f.y. 2012-13 was conducted by M/s A.R. & Co. who was appointed by inviting open tenders for the f.y. 2010-11 for conducting the statutory audit which was further renewed for conduction for the f.y. 2011-12 & 2012-13 with the concurrence of the MoHFW, GoI.

The action of finalization of tender will be completed by 31.03.2014 so that as directed by MoHFW, GoI the statutory audit of all programs and IDHSs and SHS (D) will be completed by 31.7.2014 positively.

# Funds for help desk for senior citizen in Delhi Govt. Hospital

Funds @ Rs. 100/- per volunteer per day (3 for hospitals with more than 100 beds & 2 for hospital with less than 100 beds) were being provided under Mission Flexi Pool. In the current financial year, the funds were not approved with the comments that the proposal can be submitted under National Program for Health Care of Elderly (NPHCE) in the current year. However, the approval for NPHCE has not been received. The State has been asked to rework the proposal as per guidelines. In 2012-13, a fund of Rs. 22.50 Lakhs was approved for 66 Volunteers. Only Rs. 3,47,000 have been booked as expenditure in 2012-13.

State Health Society (Delhi) approved that GoI may be requested to permit utilization of unspent amount of the funds approved in 2012-13 for help desk for senior citizen in Delhi Govt. Hospital in the current financial year.

## Setting up of e-office:

SHS (D) approved the implementation of e-office in State Program Management Unit of DSHM with the funds available under the interest for a total estimate of approximately Rs. 15 Lakhs through NICSI.

#### Agenda Point No.9

#### The budget approval of NPCB Delhi 2013-14.

SHS (D) was informed that Rs. 164.45 lacs were approved by GoI for various activity and Rs. 10 lacs were approved for management cost, total amount Rs. 174.45 lacs. As per conditionality of Prog. Division, the 25% State Share is over and above this amount and will be used in recurrent activity.

SHS (D) approved the allocation for Districts & State Unit as per Annexure-V.

A) SHS (D) approved the revision in the remuneration of SHS & IDHS Employees working in NPCB Prog. in 12th Plan as per Gol guidelines as per Annexure-VI.

#### Agenda Point No.10:

#### Approval of Second Supplementary PIP

SHS (D) was informed that approval of Second Supplementary PIP submitted to GoI has been received. A fund of Rs 1.69 Crores has been approved. Thus the total approval in the current year is Rs 285.02 crores.

#### Agenda Point No.11

#### Mobile Mental Health Units

SHS (D) approved the proposal for Rs. 12 lacs for the operational cost of the existing two Mobile Mental Health Units subject to approval by GoI.

Strengthening of National Mental Health Program to cover the entire State should be considered.

# Agenda Point No.12

#### RNTCP issue

1. In the year 2012-13 only 40% of the approval budget was released. Therefore, there are committed liabilities under different heads which have been informed to be amounting to Rs. 3,73.26 lacs. ESI has also attached from the account Rs 3,44915/ reducing the funds available in 2013-14 for programme implementation. GoI has been requested to release additional funds in the current year. SPO, MD DSIIM to follow up with GoI to resolve the issue as it may affect programme implementation. No extra funds over and above the funds allocated by GoI in its budget shall be spent in 2013-14.



- Issue-of-parity of remuncration to LT, TBHV—Proposal for enhancement of monthly-remuneration of Laboratory Technician and DOTS providers to bring it at par with the monthly remuneration of the corresponding positions under Delhi State Health Mission with the total financial implication of Rs. 11.66 lacs has been submitted to Govt. of India SHS directed that a Cabinet Note requesting state funds to be prepared by SPO RNTCP.
- 3. EPF ESI issue of DTUS: The liability of DTUS society for ESI/EFF has already been taken up by MD DSHM, SPOs of SPMU with Director incharge of DELHi in MoHFW in Gol. He informed that since exemption is there after 2005, the applicability of ESI, EPF can be examined only for the period prior to 2005. SPO RNTCP was informed of this and requested to follow up with the vertical division as well as the Director incharge on this issue. Meeting with commissioners of ESI, EPF may also be arranged to sort out the issue at the earliest.

## Agenda Point No. 13

SHS (D) was informed about the expenditure incurred in the current financial year as per Annexure-VII. The expenditure shall be expedited and accounts made up to date.

## Agenda Point No. 14

14 (i) SEED PUHC: Approval for operational cost of 63 Seed PUHCs had been received for the current financial year. 58 Seed PUHCs have been functionalized till date.

SHS (D) approved that 5 more Seed PUHCs may be operationalized at Abulfajal Enclave (South East), Kapashera Shalapur (South West), Ghitorni (New Delhi), Usmaanpur (North East) & Vikas Nagar (West). It also approved the utilization of the unspent balance of 2012-13 in current financial year for procurement of Furniture and Equipments for these centres under intimation to Gol.

Proposal for setting up of another 5 new Seed PUHCs in 2014-15 was also approved.

- 14 (iii) State Health System Resource Centre: SHS (D) approved the proposal for 5 Consultants with Salary up to Rs. 1,00,000/- p.m. supported by 3 Stenographers and 1 Administrative Assistant should be included in the State proposal with the primary objective of strengthening the procurement system for drugs and equipments.
- 14 (iv) ASHA Scheme: ASHA Scheme is an ongoing activity. There are 4082 ASHAs in place as against the target of 5018. Main components of the Scheme are Selection / training / incentives / support structures / Logistics and kits / Grievance redressal and Monitoring.
